

Pastor's Weekly Devotional- May 30th, 2019

“Do You Matter To God?”

The largest object visible to the naked eye is a small patch of light in the night sky known as Andromeda Nebula. It is a galaxy about 600 quadrillion miles across.

How small do you feel now? But God cares for you in your “smallness.” Here’s an example: Jesus said: “...even the hairs on your head are numbered.” No. 1, No. 236...and so on. God does not reckon importance by size. He is infinitely great; so He is not impressed by our mere physical dimensions, occupations or social status.
